Recommendations:

R2. This recommendation will not be implemented because it is not reasonable. The recommendation assumes that all Districts and their flood control facilities are essentially the same. They are not. RD 800 and other RD's have different maintenance schedules and items of concern. What is considered "best practice" for one district isn't necessarily a best practice for another. Seasonal specific tasks again are different from District to District. The levees are built to different standards and require different maintenance; for that reason a joint website would not be feasible.

R3. This recommendation will not be implemented because it is not reasonable. The levees in the Delta have different regulations/standards according to how they are rated and depending on whether they protect urban areas (like Discovery Bay) or agricultural areas (like most other RD's in the County). A conference to discuss RD 800's 200 year levee program would have little meaning to other RD's. Similarly, discussions of the 100 year levee standards, which would help some Districts, is of no use to RD 800. For these reasons, such a conference would be time consuming and expensive.

R4. This recommendation has already been implemented by RD 800. The District Engineer and the District Attorney attend all Board meetings and have a place on the agenda to discuss new guidelines and standards that affect the District. The District Engineer presents the Board with flood preparedness/emergency training binders and goes over the District's responsibilities and tasks in an emergency situation.

R5. This recommendation has not yet been implemented, but will be implemented in the near future. The District will immediately begin working on a list of contacts and information for "mutual aid" purposes. The District anticipates that this will be finalized by November 2016.
